Chief,

We are writing due to some people that assisted us getting E35 back up and running while on the fire in NE. We had several things go wrong with the plumbing on E35 and were suited for de-mob if it could not get fixed.

Our first visit was to Hency Plumbing and Hydronics, Inc. where we met Ann Hency. She assisted us in trying to locate the fitting we needed. Come to find out, the piece we needed was a custom piece and could not be ordered. In an attempt to get the piece welded so we could finish our assignment, Ann helped us find a welder that could help us out. We were steered towards Ron of Ron's Repair Shop...Ron dropped what he was doing and had us on our way in a hurry.

Ann had all the tools we needed in her shop to get everything disassembled and reassembled.

On third stop was Sturdevant's Auto Parts where we found a replacement for our missing set screw on our 3" suction connection.

In order to get that repaired our fourth stop was the Chadron Volunteer Fire Dept, and the guys there took apart a 2.5" connection so we could use the ball bearings from it.

All in all, this cost the department \$0.

Ann provided exceptional customer service as well as lending us the tools from her husband's shop.

Ron provided his services free of charge.

Cliff at Sturdevant's provided the new screw free of charge.

The folks at the Chadron Fire Dept. didn't hesitate in helping us find a solution which included taking apart one of their own fittings.

We are writing hoping that you would write these three businesses and the Chadron Fire Dept a letter of appreciation from the department...recognizing their graciousness and willingness to help...these people took the time out of their day to get us up and running at no cost other than a smile, a handshake, and a thank you.
