(REGIONAL)-The drought of 2012 reduced forage supply and has produced many challenges for cow/calf producers. An upcoming series, the 2012-2013 Beef Short Courses, will focus on management strategies that will help producers work through and develop plans for their cow/calf enterprise.

On Thursday, December 13th, presenter Rick Rasby will focus on feeding strategies, and on Thursday, December 20th, Dr. Richard Randle will address managing body condition and difficult births at calving. Programs on January 17th and 24th will feature Drs. Jerry Volesky and Bruce Anderson discussing range and pasture conditions depending on winter and spring moisture.
