(Crawford)-The Prehistoric Prairie Discovery Committee (PPDC) will hold their annual meeting on Saturday at Fort Robinson State Park. Activities begin at 5:00 p.m. with an Open House and hors d'oeuvres at the Trailside Museum, moving at 6:00 p.m. to the Buffalo Soldier Barracks for a silent auction, wine tasting, and dinner at 7:00 p.m. PPDC is pleased to feature Daniel Born, M.S. as the keynote speaker for the evening. A short business meeting will complete the evening.

Born is the District Archaeologist for the Northern Hills Ranger District on the Black Hills National Forest. Born has a B.A. in Anthropology from Minnesota State University and a Master's in Geography from Saint Cloud State University. Born's evening presentation, "Phytolith Indicators of Paleoecology at the Hudson-Meng Bison Bonebed," is based on his research into ancient grassland systems at Hudson-Meng. The presentation will last about an hour.

Dennis Kuhnel, the Hudson-Meng Education and Research Center Director said this will be an exciting meeting for PPDC, discussing recent successes and planning next year's activities to support area heritage sites. From a Hudson-Meng perspective, Kuhnel said they really appreciate all the good work PPDC accomplishes year in and year out.

PPDC is a non-profit coalition representing the Hudson-Meng Education and Research Center, Trailside Museum and Toadstool Geologic Park near Crawford, Nebraska.
